



DRIVE

Miami Book Fair closes streets around MDC's Wolfson campus. If you're driving use 145 NE Fifth Street to map your route. Please note that there is a one-block walk between the garage and the closest Fair entrance.

PARK

Free parking is available at the MDC Wolfson Campus Parking Garage from Sunday, November 16, to Sunday, November 23. The garage is located at **500 NE Second Avenue; the entrance is on NE Fifth Street between First and Second avenues**.

Additional nearby parking options are available for a fee through the Miami Parking Authority; the closest garages are College Station at 190 NE Third St. (access via NE Second Street) and Convention Center at 100 SE Second St./Bank of America Building.

RIDE

METRORAIL

Take Metrorail to Government Center, transfer to the Metromover, then exit at College Bayside or College North.

BRIGHTLINE

Take the train to the MiamiCentral Brightline station, transfer to Metromover's Inner Loop, then exit at College Bayside or College North.

The Miami Book Fair poster — a bespoke work of art that reflects both the event and our city — is made possible by an important collaboration with New World School of the Arts. Through it, some of Miami's most talented emerging young artists are granted the opportunity to glean inspiration from the place they call home, flex their creative muscles, and get real-world experience while building their professional portfolios. This year, Ian Teresa-Calleja submitted the winning design. His vision was informed by Miami's everevolving landscape — from gleaming skyscrapers to revitalized streets and neighborhoods.

"I wanted to draw a parallel between the city's physical growth and the personal growth we experience through reading," said Teresa-Calleja. "Books, like cities, help us build new ways of thinking. That process isn't always easy, but it's powerful — and worth it. Most of all, I wanted to create something inviting, a world that draws you in, just like a good book does."

The 2025 poster beautifully captures a special moment in Miami, a city in transformation that continues to grow and build, with Miami Book Fair as a fundamental part of its foundation.

His work revolves around typography as a tool for visual communication and how type can be used in creative and expressive ways.
