## About the 2025 City of Miami Elections

General Election — November 4, 2025

Miami voters will elect the **Mayor** and **City Commissioners for Districts 3 and 5**, and vote on **four Charter Amendment questions.** 

If no candidate receives more than 50% of the vote, a runoff election will follow.

### **Key Deadlines & How to Vote**

### **Vote-by-Mail**

Ballots are now arriving in voters' mailboxes-it is too late to request a VBM ballot.

Return your ballot early by mail or at a secure drop box. See drop-off options.

Your ballot must be received, not postmarked by 7 p.m. Tuesday, November 4 to count.

You can still vote in person if you prefer—bring your VBM ballot to polling place to surrender it.

# **Early or In-Person Voting**

Verify your polling place or find early-voting sites. Early voting dates are: Weekends: October 25–26 and November 1–2, 8 am–4 pm
Weekdays — October 27–31, 7 am–7 pm
